

Canadian War Museum Otawa, ON 04-17 to 01-18 Explore the lasting impact of the Battle of Vimy Ridge, 100 years later.

A WIDELY CELEBRATED victory and an iconic event in Canadian military history, the Battle of Vimy Ridge was also one of the country's bloodiest engagements. There were more than 10,000 casualties in the battle, which took place from April 9 to 12, 1917.

This souvenir catalogue explores how perceptions of Vimy have evolved over the past century from a tactical battlefield victory in France to a nation-defining event. Understand the larger context of the Franco-British offensive — the preparation, the defenders, the capture of the ridge and its consequences. Then take a step back to examine the evolving memory of the battle in Canada over the last 100 years. It is a potent reminder of how we construct our past and shape our present through acts of commemoration.

MÉLANIE MORIN-PELLETIER is a historian of the First World War at the Canadian War Museum and the author of Fighting in Flanders: Gas. Mud. Memory. and Briser les ailes de l'ange : les infirmières militaires canadiennes, 1914-1918.

IN 1982, the Government of Canada engaged in the design and construction of the National Museum of Man — now the Canadian Museum of History, an iconic building on the shores of the Ottawa River. Based on the strength of his vision, Douglas Cardinal was selected from among 12 distinguished finalists as the architect of record.

Today, the Museum of History is the largest and most visited museum in the country, and the building is a must-see destination for tourists visiting the region. In his *Design Principles*, Cardinal reflects on his vision for the building and its surroundings – how the grand curvilinear forms allow visitors to feel the Museum's connection with nature. Moving through its spaces is an extraordinarily interesting experience that is truly Canadian.

**DOUGLAS CARDINAL** is credited with creating an Indigenous style of Canadian architecture, characterized by gracious organic forms, which continually challenged the most advanced engineering standards.

Discover the architectural vision behind Canada's striking and iconic national museum of military history.

SINCE ITS OPENING to the public on May 8, 2005, the 60th anniversary of VE Day, the Canadian War Museum has become a recognizable icon. The building was an instant success and, over the years, has become a recognizable destination for Canadians and visitors to Canada wishing to understand how military history has shaped our country, while marveling at the building's architectural symbolism.

Renowned architect Raymond Moriyama's remarkable commentary on the design principles of the building highlights the vision behind each structural element — from the echoes of the Canadian landscape, to the sound of nature in Regeneration Hall, to the axis of the sun at 11 a.m. on Remembrance Day. The Legacy Document is a key reference for the conservation of the Canadian War Museum, and it explores Moriyama's dream for the future of the building and its landscape.

RAYMOND MORIYAMA is a Companion of the Order of Canada and winner of a Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts. He is recognized for several landmark buildings both in Canada and abroad.
